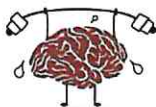

MINI FRUIT SANDWICHES

INGREDIENTS:

4 slices whole wheat bread, crusts removed

1/4 cup plain cream cheese

1/2 cup sliced strawberries

1/4 cup fresh blueberries



DIRECTIONS:

1. Spread half of the bread slices with cream cheese.
2. Top with sliced strawberries then top with the other bread halves. Cut into triangles.
3. Top with a blueberry and toothpick to serve.
4. Refrigerate.

SPARKLER SKEWERS



INGREDIENTS:

12 strawberries, halved

24 fresh blueberries

12 mini mozzarella balls, halved

1/4 cup balsamic vinegar

DIRECTIONS:

1. Place 1/2 strawberry on a plate. Use a toothpick or skewer to add and secure a mozzarella slice and blueberry on top.
2. Serve on a platter with a bowl of balsamic vinegar for dipping.

FIREWORK POPCORN

INGREDIENTS:

2 bags microwave popcorn, cooked

3 tbsp unsalted butter

1/2 cup blue and red M&Ms

1/2 tsp kosher salt

1/4 cup dried cranberries

1/4 cup dried blueberries



DIRECTIONS:

1. Make popcorn.
2. Add butter and salt to popcorn and stir to combine.
3. Add dried cranberries and blueberries and stir to combine.
4. Add M & M's, stir.
5. Serve and enjoy!

RED, WHITE & BLUE BANANAS

INGREDIENTS:

Bunch of bananas

Ghiradelli melting wafers

4th of July sprinkles

red, white & blue sprinkles



DIRECTIONS:

1. Melt chocolate according to package.
2. Peel banana and stick half way in through the end.
3. Dip and twist banana in chocolate.
4. Top or roll in sprinkles.
5. Place in freezer for 5 minutes or more.

MORE 4TH OF JULY SNACKS TO SHARE

FIRECRACKER HOT DOGS

INGREDIENTS:

- 16 hot dogs
- 1 can breadstick dough, refrigerated
- 1 star cookie cutter
- 16 thick slices Colby cheese
- 16 wooden skewers



DIRECTIONS:

1. Pierce hotdogs all the way through each one.
2. Wrap each hot dog in biscuit dough using a spinning pattern.
3. Bake at 350 for 20 minutes.
4. Using star cookie cutter, cut cheese in star shape and attach to top of dogs.
5. Serve.

RED, WHITE & BLUE KRISPIE BITES

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 box rice krispie cereal
- Red, blue food coloring
- 1 butter
- 1 bag mini marshmallows



DIRECTIONS:

1. Melt butter on low heat.
2. Mix in marshmallows and stir until completely melted.
3. Remove from heat. Separate into 3 bowls.
4. Evenly stir in food coloring until completely stirred.
5. Add krispie cereal to each bowl, cover completely.
6. Roll into balls. (May need to cover hands in butter)
7. Organize in flag pattern. Serve.

FIRECRACKER SUGAR COOKIES

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ cups all purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp baking powder
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups white sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 baggies poprocks
- Vanilla frosting
- Red, white, blue sprinkles

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. In a small bowl, stir together flour, baking soda and baking powder. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl, cream together the butter and sugar until smooth. Beat in egg and vanilla. Gradually blend in the dry ingredients. Roll rounded teaspoonfuls of dough into balls, and place onto ungreased cookie sheets.
3. Bake 8 to 10 minutes in the preheated oven, or until golden. Let stand on cookie sheet two minutes.
4. In small bowl, mix Poprocks and sprinkles together.
5. Frost each cookie, top with sprinkle and Poprocks mixture.
6. Enjoy!

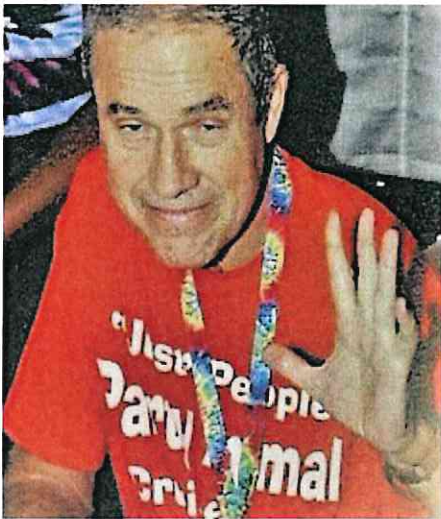
